COMMITTEE REPORTS

Streets & Alleys: Justin Parchert reported that Brandt will have to reseed the Fancy Creek Project area.

Justin also reported that he is working on getting Brandt to address some issues that he has pointed out in the Fancy Creek Project. We have not paid the final payment, due to these issues.

Finance & Audit: Nothing to report.

Buildings & Grounds: Trustee Yakovich reported that all the flood fighting efforts went well. Justin has taken down most of the pumps. There are a few pumps that need some maintenance. He will be addressing them.

Justin is cleaning out the Flood Building while the building is empty.

Harbor: Trustee Kelly reported that the flood water is down.

Justin reported that one of the docks is sitting at an angle. He will pull it as soon as he can for repairs and resetting.

The Seawall project is due to begin soon. The contract gives Superior Seawalls until the fall to complete.

Parks & Recreation: Trustee Lueker reported that the parks are being mowed and maintained for the season.

Police: Nothing to report.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS:

Village Clerk: Clerk Hoffman informed the Trustees that the Auditors will be in the office beginning the week of June 22nd.

Clerk Hoffman reminded the Trustees that the annual appointments of the Village Treasurer and Village Clerk are due. It will be on the agenda at the next meeting.

Public Works Director: Justin Parchert reported that he hasn't looked into the flood gates as of today. He will address them soon.

The Back ho is working again.

The Kubota needs transmission work. It is unknown at this time how much it will cost.

Mayor: Nothing to report

New Business: The Trustees unanimously agreed to give a 3% pay increase to Justin Parchert, Shelly Hoffman and Vickie Powell. The part-time Maintenance workers will receive a pay raise up to \$20.00 per hour a piece.

The Rookies ball Team has asked for a donation to help with costs for replacing the yellow polycap fence cap. They asked for a donation of \$400.00. The Trustees unanimously agreed to donate the requested amount of \$400.00.

Citizen Comments: Tyler Kargl was present to request permission from the Trustees to put up a utility shed on his property. The shed will be larger than average. He has reached out to his neighbors to ask if they had any issues with it or it's size, so far there are no problems. The Trustees instructed Clerk Hoffman to put it on the agenda for vota at the next meeting.

Bill Campbell asked the Trustees what they thought about him holding a 3-point shot free-throw tournament at the Lion's Park. The Trustees asked Bill to bring more information to the next board meeting.

The Trustees decided to put on a super special fireworks display at the fish fry for the USA's 250th Anniversary.
