Harbor: Trustee Kelly reported that there is a lot of activity at the Harbor.

Parks & Recreation: Trustee Lueker reported that the Pickle Ball courts are attracting a lot of attention.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS:

Village Clerk: Clerk Hoffman reported that someone bought the old Packman Pizza's building. He is opening a CNC Plasma Business.

Clerk Hoffman also reported that she has several training sessions scheduled for the new Village App. The App should be live around Mid-July.

Public Works Director: The road project that Taylor Ridge Paving will be doing will begin on June 17th or 18th. They are working on 7th Avenue East, to the East of 3rd Street East.

There are several downed trees on the levee west of the Harbor parking lot. Justin and his crew will be cleaning things up once the ground dries out.

There was a flooding event that happened on June 7th. The flooding was at a level that we haven't seen before and had no way to plan for. Tensions got high and Justin snapped on a few residents. He has since apologized for his outburst. Two homes were damaged significantly during the flashflood; the Red Cross is helping the families. The County inspectors and EMA were both out to inspect the flood area. There were several donations given for the residents for which Justin wanted to thank publicly.

There was minor damage to one of our roads and a damaged flood gate that will be repaired.

Mayor: Nothing to report.

Citizen Comments: Chase Schwigen was present to present his new plat plans for the Liberty Park Phase 3 expansion. He left several plat maps.

Karen Hitchcock was present to ask the Trustees to consider putting a stop sign in on the dead-end road of 3rd Street East. The Trustees said they will consider the request after speaking with Justin Parchert.

Bill Campbell said, that there will most likely be more complaints about the e-bikes and scooters. It is a real problem.
