

CHAPTER 4

BILLIARD, POOL HALLS

SECTION:

- 3-4-1: License Required
- 3-4-2: Fee
- 3-4-3: Minors
- 3-4-4: Hours of Operation
- 3-4-5: Penalty

3-4-1: LICENSE REQUIRED: No person shall operate, maintain or conduct a billiard, pool, bagatelle or pigeon hole table open to the public without having first obtained a license therefor as is herein provided. All applications for such a license shall state thereon the intended location of the place of business and the number of tables to be used therein. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 181)

3-4-2: FEE: The annual fee for any such license shall be twelve dollars fifty cents (\$12.50) for each table. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 182)

3-4-3: MINORS: Minors under the age of sixteen (16) years shall under no circumstances frequent, loiter, go or remain in any hall licensed hereunder at any time, unless it is upon some lawful errand, and under the direction and with the consent and knowledge of the parents, guardian or other person having the lawful custody of said minor; and it shall be unlawful for the proprietor of any hall so licensed to allow or permit any such minor to frequent, loiter or remain within such hall in violation of the Section. 3-4-4: HOURS OF OPERATION: No billiard hall, or other hall licensed hereunder shall be open for business, or used, between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and six o'clock (6:00) in the morning. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 1984)

3-4-5: PENALTY: Any person violating any provision of this Chapter shall be fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each offense; and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 185; amd. Ord. 338, 1-3-77)
