

CHAPTER 7

PUBLIC DANCES

SECTION:

3-7-1: LICENSE REQUIRED: It shall be unlawful to operate or conduct a public dance in the Village without having first obtained a license therefor as is herein provided. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 198)

3-7-2: APPLICATION: Applications for such licenses shall be made in conformance with the provisions of this Code relating to licenses, and shall specify the location of the proposed dance or dances and the person or organization sponsoring the same.

No such license shall be issued to a person who is not a person of good moral character, nor to a corporation or organization which is not represented in the Village by a person of good moral character. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 199)

3-7-3: INVESTIGATION: It shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to make or cause to be made an investigation into the character of each applicant and report the results of such investigation to the Village Board. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 200)

3-7-4: FEES: The fees for such public dances shall be as follows:

Annual license	\$150.00
For one day	15.00

Any dance hall in the Village shall be exempt from these fees. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 201)

3-7-5: PREMISES: It shall be unlawful to conduct a public dance in any hall or place which is not equipped with sufficient and adequate exits; and no hall or building which is not provided with at least exits of four feet (4') or more in width shall be used for such purpose. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 202)

3-7-6: CONDUCT: It shall be unlawful to indulge in or to permit any improper or immoral conduct at any public dance. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 203)

3-7-7: CLOSING HOURS: No person shall operate, keep open or permit the operation or the keeping open of any public dance or dance after the hour of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight on any day anywhere in the Village. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 204)

3-7-8: PENALTY: Any person violating any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each offense; and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.
