

CHAPTER 12

COMMERCIAL FISHERMEN AND CLAM DIGGERS

3-12-1: LICENSE REQUIRED: It shall be unlawful for any person to go upon, or for any firm or corporation to send any person upon that portion of the Village property which is now under lease from the Federal Government when such person is engaging in the business of commercial fisherman or clam digger and intends to use such property for the purpose of landing or docking his boat or for the storage of necessary equipment incident to the business of clam digger or commercial fisherman, without first securing a license therefor.

The term "commercial fisherman" shall mean any person who catches or procures fish from the river in any manner and sells or offers for sale such fish in order to gain all or part of his livelihood.

The term "clam digger" shall mean any person who procures mussells or clams or clam shells from the river and sells or offers to sell the same in order to gain all or part of his livelihood. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 269)

3-12-2: APPLICATION; FEE: Applications for such licenses shall be made to the Village Clerk and shall be payable on or before April 1 of each year. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 270)

3-12-3: USE OF FUNDS: All fees collected hereunder shall be kept in a separate fund and shall be used to clean up and maintain in good condition the above mentioned leased premises. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 271)

3-12-4: LIST: The Clerk shall keep a list of all such licenses and the names of the holders thereof. He shall give a copy of such list to the Board of Trustees. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 272)

3-12-5: PENALTY: Any person violating any provision of this Chapter shall be fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each offense; and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues. (M.C. 1949, Sec. 273; amd. Ord. 338, 1-3-77)
